Julie has been a CWRU adjunct faculty member in the MPH program and teaching in the Mandel School of Applied Social Sciences since 2008. For the 9 years prior to returning to CWRU, Julie was the Director of Capacity Building at the AIDS Taskforce of Greater Cleveland providing a series of HIV/AIDS professional development workshops for human service professionals who serve Greater Cleveland. Julie is a former community co-chair of the Cuyahoga County HIV Prevention Regional Advisory Group and a founding member of the CWRU AIDS Clinical Trials Unit / University Hospitals Biomedical HIV Prevention Community Advisory Board. Prior to her work in Cleveland, Julie was an HIV educator and advocate in Seattle, Washington, serving in a number of roles with the Seattle-King County Department of Public Health and what is now the Lifelong AIDS Alliance. She received her BA in from Tufts University and her MPH from The University of Michigan.
